Charles Darwin actually had a huge positive influence on the opposite end of the spectrum While social Darwinists saw Darwin's theories as a way to justify greed and oppression, Karl Marx viewed them as an allegory for class struggles The German philosopher saw Darwin's Origin of Species as the biological basis of socialism

Charles Robert Darwin was born February 12, 1809 in Shrewsbury, England His family was of the newly emerged, newly wealthy, provincial professional class Early in his youth he demonstrated predilections for hunting, natural history, and scientific experimentation In 1825, after public school education, he enrolled at Edinburgh University
